

ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO

As you may already be aware, memberships for 2020 renewals opened on the 1 November.

I am pleased to advise that there have been no increases in current ACTA membership fees for next year. As we move towards 2020, we trust that our clubs will continue to embrace the opportunity to attract new members to their ranks and provide them with a positive, safe and enjoyable exposure to our sport. Being an Olympic year, we can be assured that our sport will obtain an increased exposure come 24 July and will hopefully obtain some podium results that will ensure even more media exposure and participant interest.

2020 will also see some brave new changes in a few other areas. In our recent Risk Management Report and Plan, major concerns were raised with regard to the payment of cash prizes at competitions. Not only does this expose the recipients to risk by receiving cash that can be lost or stolen during or post-event, it is also a major risk for office personnel who have to withdraw and carry huge amounts of cash from our bank prior to the events then count, carry and hold the cash in envelopes at the venue for collection by the event winners. While I am probably going to earn the wrath of some members, (this may not be the most popular decision for some), by necessity, electronic payment processing of these prizes will need to occur for all National Titles commencing in 2020. Please be assured that the only thing that will change here is the delivery method ... all prizes will still be paid to winners of events where cash prizes are offered ... the only change will be the actual payment process. Our current thoughts are that each winner will be sent an email post-event congratulating them of their win and asking them to please forward us their bank account details for payment of the cash prize. So, those of you who are fortunate enough to be "in the money" come next Nationals, please be aware and ready for this new transition.

Target Tender and Testing

Every couple of years the ACTA offers the target manufacturers / importers the opportunity to supply us with test targets from which we target test and determine which targets we will be using at the National Ground for our National Championships. The process is pretty simple. A single brand / type of target is randomly loaded into each trap house, the only

person knowing the brand and type of each target in each trap being the CEO, (the number of trap houses used being the number of different targets supplied/ tested). A group of AA Grade shooters are brought to the ground to "test" the targets. They progress from layout to layout, shooting a set number of targets per layout each, following which they grade each target on break-ability, flight characteristic / consistency and visual ease of sighting. An observer also independently performs the same grading for the full complement of targets thrown. During the test, no communication is had with or between testers or observer, and they independently score each target at the end of their test on each layout. We also test each target to determine its hardness.

At the end of the test, scores are tallied by the CEO, and the targets are placed in a table from most highly rated to lowest. The results are then forwarded to the Executive Committee for them to endorse the preferred target. We will announce the results in the Clay Target newsletter as soon as they are available.

This tender is currently being conducted for the years of 2020 and 2021. Manufacturers are excitedly discussing the wonderful advancements that have occurred in enviro / eco-targets in recent years, a number feeling confident that this new variant will now out-perform their traditional pitch targets. We look forward to advising the outcome in due course!

Sponsorships

We are also in the process of presenting sponsorship proposals to potential sponsors for the next two years. With recognition that we have some wonderful sponsors, we are developing different tiers of sponsorship from Platinum to Bronze and Trade Fair only. Hopefully this will offer our supporters a wide range of opportunities and promotions that will be reflected at future National Events and associated activities.

Progress on the National Ground – Grounds and Facilities Service Team

Those of you who live locally may have noticed some

major cosmetic improvements at the National Ground over the last month. This is due to the pride, enthusiasm and energy being thrown into the Grounds by our new Grounds maintenance team, Brenton and John. Both are very excited to be working with us and getting into the job, and we feel confident that we have made a great decision in hiring these gentlemen at the Association. They are both very positive, can-do people who have already come up with some solutions and great ideas to improve the amenities and make them more userfriendly moving forward.

We have also recently been progressing through the recruitment process for the Media, Marketing and Facilities Coordinator's position. This employee will concentrate the majority of their time delivering The Range Function Centre and also performing a lesser role in editing the Clay Target newsletter and some social media. With Maureen now moving towards her last month at the Association, we will soon have more new faces than old!

ACTA Hall of Fame

In another piece of exciting news regarding The Range Function Centre, Mark McInnes has offered to assist with the Trap Hall of Fame, and in doing so, will bring all history and inductees particulars up to date. Many of you who have visited the National Grounds will be aware that the main foyer of The Range is intended to, in the future, be a Walk of Fame. Currently we have one photo montage highlighting the great Donald Mackintosh, Australia's first Olympic shooting Gold medallist, who has been accoladed with National competitions and teams named in his honour. With *Mark's kind assistance, we hope to expand this display* with other great champions of our sport over the coming years. Mark is also making some suggestions and has some great ideas to implement in order to rejuvenate the Trap Hall of Fame presentation dinner with a new format that will add more glamour to the event.

ACTA Strategic Plan

To other breaking news, we are currently speaking with a Queensland company with the view to preparing a strategic plan proposal. We will hopefully be in a position to present this to the National Executive early next year. We feel this is an extremely important project for the ACTA to embark upon as a new Strategic Plan will shape the direction of our organisation moving forward and help us to be more proactive in an everchanging, customer-focussed business.

Russell Mark Sport Australia Hall of Fame

This is the highest accolade that any sportsperson in Australia can receive – the induction into the Sport Australia Hall of Fame. In the past there have been 572 inductions across a myriad of sports and contributions; from our bestknown athletes to some of our hardest working administrators. The 35th Induction Awards was certainly a gala event and, understandably, considered sporting Australia's Night of Nights.

It was a daunting request when I was asked to "write up" the nomination for Russell to be inducted into the Hall of Fame. A man that I did not personally know, at that stage, but one that I recognised and respected as an outstanding Australian sporting champion and a well-known competitor of the highest order in clay target shooting.

His list of achievements is extensive and exceptional.

On reading through the brief I had been provided with my first impression was "why has it taken so long for Russell to be nominated?". Russell's highlights include:

Just to name a few! Russell's achievement list is phenomenal and in 2007 the International Shooting Sports Federation inducted him into its Hall of Fame as"the Greatest Double Trap Shooter of all time!" In 2009 Russell was inducted into the ACTA's Hall of Fame as its youngest ever member.

The night itself, a very formal 'black tie' affair, was a collection of "Who's Who" of Australian Sport. It was an absolute privilege to be part of the group that was at the event to help Russell celebrate his induction. The group included Russell's family, friends and representatives from ACTA, VCTA and Shooting Australia – it was certainly an honour to be there.

Among all the speeches and awards there was one thing that stood out for me, in particular. During Russell's acceptance speech, and in different conversations during the night, Russell made reference to a particularly relevant point – (paraphrased) – "recognition for an athlete's performance, particularly in the shooting sports, only comes after success at Olympic or Commonwealth success".

Russell, you are an absolute champion of our sport. Well done and well deserved.

Once we completed another quick briefing in the Clubhouse, we all headed out to the walks to hit some targets. In single file, from the centre lane and over two layouts, they each got a few shots away before they got the hang of it and started punishing those targets.

It was an excellent group of students that had a heap of fun doing something way different during their sports lessons – and at the end we had a competition of guys against gals. Let me tell you that there were some serious 'guns' among the group as no one relented to having the others win. Special thanks must go out to Mal Jurgs from the school for assisting in the organising and delivering the school to us. We've done this a few times now and the students get a real kick out of learning and trying something like this.

Thanks also to our State Secretary Deb McPherson for spending the time on the day with the kids who are sometimes a bit timid. She works so well with them to make them feel comfortable and passes on her ability to get them hitting targets.

All in all, a great day was had by all, and everyone left with a great smile on their face. The 'Certificates of Achievement' will be passed onto the students at one of the school assemblies over the coming weeks so they all have a memento of their attendance.



2020 ACTA Rule Book

A new revised edition of the ACTA Shooting Rules will take effect from January 1st 2020.

Revised January 2020

This revised Rule Book is the culmination of many months of work following on from the July 2019 Rules Supervisors' meeting. The ACTA Executive have now ratified the proposed changes and every ACTA member will be emailed a link to the new 2020 Shooting Rules along with their emailed link to the January 2020 edition of Clay Target on December 16.

All new or altered Rules will appear in **RED** type to enable shooters to quickly recognise and comprehend the changes.

Two important changes, which shooters, handicappers and club management need

to be aware of, are in relation to scores to be recorded in the shooter's Record Card.

1. DOUBLE RISE – this is now a recordable event, see below for explanation and new Rule 1.14.

EXPLANATION:

As of Jan. 1, 2020 all shooters will be without a grade in DOUBLE RISE.

Shooters will initially shoot the first 25 pair (50 targets) under their present trap grade and will then be given a PROVISIONAL GRADE as per Rule 2.01(v). At the conclusion of another 75 pair (150) targets they will be GRADED.

As to where the DOUBLE RISE scores are recorded – the suggestion is that shooters/ handicappers change either manually or by sticker or stamp, the heading on page 26 of the grading card to read "DOUBLE RISE". This will ensure a uniformity of page number for handicappers to look for and use when recording Double Rise. Alternatively if these pages are already taken up with scores, find other alternate unused pages.

Please Note: AA ELITE status does not apply to Double Rise grading, as this status was bestowed based on Trap scores off 15 metres and the 25 metre Handicap mark. This will therefore mean that AA Elite shooters will need to produce their Record Cards at shoots to have their Double Rise scores recorded.

AA ELITE shooters, who have established this status under either the Trap or Skeet disciplines need to understand that this status only applies to the discipline that they qualified in. In the alternate discipline, that is TRAP or SKEET as well as TOWER, BALL TRAP, SPORTING and now DOUBLE RISE, Record Cards need to presented when nominating for scores to be recorded.

RULE:

1.14 DOUBLE RISE

- (a) Double Rise shall be shot squad system and called by the referee, 1-1 or lost – 1 or 1 – lost or lost lost, whichever the case may be, each target to count one point.
- (b) A competitor must shoot at a complete pair of targets on every occasion, each target broken by the competitor's shot shall score one point. Two shots must not be fired at either target.
- (c) For initial grading refer Trap Rule 2.01(p) (i-vi).

Grades shall be: AA 92% and over; A 84% and under 92%; B 76% and under 84%; C under 76%.

- (d) A shooter may have his grade increased after shooting 100 pair (200 targets), but must shoot three (3) consecutive groups of 100 pair (200 targets) at a lower grade percentage to be down graded.
- (e) No re-grading or re-handicapping will apply until the end of the club's programme. Should a shooter shoot at another Club later on that day the new grade/handicap will take effect.

2. RECORDING OF ALL SCORES IN TRAP OTHER THAN 15 METRES –

New Rule 2.01(a)

EXPLANATION:

ALL Trap event scores shot from metreages other than those shot at Double Barrel from 15 metres will be recorded in the secondary column now used for listing Single Barrel and Continental.

However there is an exception – if 15 metre Double Barrel shoot-offs (Points Score events naturally included) are finalised from a metreage further back, then these scores will be included as shoot-off targets and recorded in the DOUBLE BARREL column, not the secondary Single Barrel/Continental column.

RULES:

2.01 COMMON MARK AND HANDICAP SHOOTING

(a) All appropriate 15 metre scores

 (competition) shall be recorded for
 percentage performance classification
 irrespective of how the event is run, with
 the exception of Eye Openers (maximum
 of 10 targets), Double Rise, and those
 shot Targets Only.

All targets shot other than 15 metre Double Barrel shall be recorded in the second column designated as Cont and SB. That includes Single Barrel, Continental, and any targets shot as single targets off oscillating traps on any metreages shot in competition. Specific Handicap events are not included.

(h) It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to enter individual event scores and progressively mark the shooter's card with his 15 metre results. After each 200 targets double barrel regrade the shooter if necessary. Double Barrel scores will be transposed for any better scores from the other events column that have a greater percentage value, ie Continental and Single Barrel and targets shot from a different mark. If the 200 targets fall during an event or shoot-off, re-grading will not take place until the completion of that event. All targets to the end of that event and shoot-off targets including those shot from greater metreages are to be entered into the event column and used in calculation of percentage, except the last target missed in any shoot-off will not be recorded. Once 200 or more targets have been shot at and recorded and after the substitution of any bad scores, the percentage shall be calculated.







A few things will need to change for next year, however at this stage the Gala Dinner was a big enough success and well welcomed by the shooters that it will make a re-appearance.




A Fun November Shoot at Bega





B/C grade proved entertaining, with Bert Deacon, Mark Evans and John Walker finishing on 23/25.



Covering member's firearms, and/or associated equipment whilst in transit, stored in a locked vehicle in accordance with State Law and/or building and damaged or destroyed whilst in use anywhere in Australia and New Zealand and overseas coverage for 21 days per year.

DEFINITIONS APPLYING TO THIS POLICY

Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases. Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.

- Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

Comments

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

The full policy document is available on the ACTA website with all other insurance documents.

For an additional \$10.00 fee any eligible member will be able to increase the insurance coverage to \$25,000.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

The SP: an effective and reliable way to resolve eye dominance issues

Over the years I have been involved with teaching new shooters how to shoot. I have been involved with the National Junior Development squads and squads from the Southern, Western and Hunter Sports academies. One issue that often arises and has been difficult to resolve is eye dominance or cross dominance problems.

A simple definition of cross dominance is when a right-handed shooter has a dominant left eye. A right-handed shooter should align the barrels with their right eye, and the opposite for a left-handed shooter. For a right-handed shooter with a dominant left eye they will often see two barrels or that the barrel they see just doesn't line up.

Eye dominance is not always stable and can change from day to day and can even change throughout a long hard day due to strain and fatigue. We have no control over which eye the brain choses to use. The only way we can be absolutely sure is to close the eye we do not want to use but then we lose depth and speed perception. Central Vision where both eyes are equally as strong or dominant can also be an issue.

There have been a number of techniques that shooters have used to alleviate this problem, or shutting off the cross dominant eye. These measures have involved eye covers or stick on spots, that cloud the vision of the dominant eye making the brain use the clearer non dominant eye. This also allows the shooter to still have access to their peripheral vision. Shooters have also installed hi-viz beads that have a tube in front of them that only lets you see the bead if you have the gun aligned. Another method is a small piece of angle plate that sits on the barrel in front of the bead that stops the dominant eye from seeing the bead. The final approach has been to get the shooter to squint or shut one eye. For those shooters who do not have cross dominance issues, know how important it is to shoot with both eyes open and to not look at the bead.

I have been supporting a number of shooters

recently who all have cross dominance problems and have difficulties getting them to open both eyes especially when shooting sporting clays. When the July issue of the UK magazine *Clay Shooting*, arrived I saw an article reviewing **the SP**, which is a simple and innovative devise designed to resolve cross dominance issues. I immediately digested the article and the website www.shootsp.co.uk and then fired off an email to Steve Randles who developed **the SP** and organised some samples to try.

The SP is a small black bud like form that is fixed to the right-hand side of the top barrel or the side rib for a right handed, left eye dominant shooter. **SP** stands for **Shot Paraboloid**, which is a three dimensional (3D) ellipse. When the gun is mounted, the cross dominant shooter will still see two barrels but only right eye can see **the SP**. **The SP** is shielded from view of the left eye. This means that the brain registers which barrel is the 'correct' one and the shooter then calls to release the clay and if they keep both eyes open the brain will subconsciously recognise the barrel with **the SP** and the shooter can shoot the target like shooters without cross dominant problems.



What is **the SP** and how does **the SP** work?

The Shootsp website explains '**The SP** is a discreet innovation fitted to the barrel of your gun that will revolutionise your shooting. **The SP** is a simple profile that maintains a constant stimulant to your eye – it works in your peripheral vision and not as a sight but as a trigger effectively controlling which eye is used to give your brain information. **The SP** is visible to only one eye and this eye will be used subconsciously by your brain to

see the shot picture. This will override your normal dominance allowing you to shoot as if naturally dominant in the eye over the rib. The gap you will see to the target will be from the eye over the rib, giving you consistency and confidence on every shot.'

The sentence above; "The SP is a simple profile that maintains a constant stimulant to your eye – it works in your peripheral vision and not as a sight but as a trigger effectively controlling which eye is used to give your brain information" is essential in understanding how **the SP** works. The brain registers the stimulus but it is vital that the shooter looks at the target and only the target. **The SP** works in the subconscious background of your brain.

After some practice, your brain is trained to look for **the SP** subconsciously and automatically realises which is the correct barrel and you can shoot the target with both eyes open. The website explains that "**The SP** is a stimulant that makes the brain sees that one barrel becomes unique and hence allowing the correct barrel to be identified in your peripheral vision subconsciously. The science is as simple as giving your eye something to see subconsciously and this will create a reaction." And the "reaction" is to shoot with both eyes open.



I gave **the SPs** to shooters who I know have cross dominance issues. One shooter, started shooting DTL with both eyes open while using **the SP** and has been shooting very respectable scores and recently won a hard-fought handicap shoot after a shoot off with several other shooters. She has also been shooting 5 stand sporting and Field and Game, where she posted personal bests and won the 100T handicap at the Field and Game shoot. The shooter is now shooting all targets with both eyes open and recently left the following message on my voicemail.

"Michael, I Just want to say **that SP** has totally changed my life. I can't believe the way I am seeing targets now with both eyes open and I'm Just blown away. Thank you for getting this, you have totally changed my whole shooting life."

Another shooter has only been shooting for less than a year and has been shooting at C grade standard. After using **the SP**, he started shooting A and AA grade scores and at a shoot recently said he couldn't believe how much better he is shooting now that he is using both eyes. He even said that those who shoot with both eyes open have a distinct advantage over those who cannot.

Because **the SP** works at a subconscious level it is difficult to explain in simple terms exactly how it works. But it does work. I have seen the shooters I have been training improve their scores in trap, skeet and sporting. They are enjoying their shooting much more and each week appear to be improving and reaching personal bests. It also appears that the shooter is shooting the targets faster but this is most likely due to better target acquisition because the peripheral vision is now working the way it should.

The take home message is that if you have cross dominance issues try **the SP**. Let it work subconsciously, behind the scenes so to speak, keep both eyes open and look at the target. Once you have mounted the gun ignore **the SP** just as you would ignore the bead at the end of your barrels. Look at the target and shoot it.

If you have an issue with cross dominance then I strongly recommend you try **the SP**. Go to **the SP** website, www.shootsp.co.uk to look at the research, testimonies and questions and answers.

39th Australasian Police and Services Clay Target Championships



26TH TO 29TH SEPTEMBER 2019

The first Australian Police Clay Target Championships were conducted in 1981 at Bendigo by the then newly formed Loddon District Police Trap Club. The inaugural Championships were a 1 day event with 115 shooters attending. In September this year the Championships were again hosted by the Loddon District Police Trap Club in Bendigo, the 39th staging of the Championships and unbelievably, 116 competitors took part. The championships were the concept of Glenn Woodhatch and with the help of Brian Mark of Winchester, became a reality. This year Glenn was still manning the office and just as enthusiastic as ever in the successful staging of the event.

Over the years the event has grown to be the Australasian Championships with New Zealand joining in 1985 and now we include all Services, hence Australasian Police and Services Clay Target Championships and instead of a 1 day event, it is now a 4 day event. Competitors attended from Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia, New Zealand as well as representatives of the Federal Police. The Championships are divided into 2 groups – Police and Services Section and Civilian Section.

Day 1 of the program saw the Skeet Championship

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter who wishes to compete in the "2020 ISSF Nationals" must be a registered member of the ACTA for the financial year 2020, or a bonified International competitor.
- 2. Every registered ACTA competitor must provide their current record card, they must also provide their previous record card if requested by the Tournament Handicapper. Bonified International competitors will be graded "AA".
- 3. In the event of any ACTA competitor not being able to produce their record card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Tournament Handicapper to ensure their scores are recorded correctly. **Note:** A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate record card and no prizes issued until.
- 4. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for ISSF Trap and Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 5. Entry is by Pre-Nominations only, to be received by close of business (Eastern Summer Time) Friday 3rd January 2020.
- 6. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Technical Director. <u>Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.</u> Refunds will only be issued if withdrawals are notified in writing 48 hours prior to the event to accounts@claytarget.com. au refunds will be processed within 30 days of completion of the event and will incur and administration fee.
- 7. Each competitor must to take enough cartridges to complete the applicable round.
- 8. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS**.
- 9. All competitors must sign the score sheet after each round prior to leaving the tracks. Once a competitor has signed the score sheet, the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by a competitor will be credited as per the score sheet.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the competition. All persons designated to referee/score must fulfil their obligation to do so or obtain the service of a suitable replacement to take their place at the required time. In the event that the designated person or their replacement does not fulfil their obligation the original person designated to fill the specific role will **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES**.
- 11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are explicitly prohibited from entering the trap pits or trap houses after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 12. The setting of targets will be conducted under the control of the Tournaments Technical Director prior to the start of the events each day. No further adjustments will be made to traps without authorization from the Technical Director.
- 13. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 15. High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors combined in each discipline.
- 16. Junior competitors are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable. Veteran competitors are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
- 17 Pre-nominations will only be accepted online on the form provided at www.claytarget.com.au
- 18. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- 19. Juniors must be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.Veterans to be over the age of 55 prior to January 1st 2020.
- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 21. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ACTA Clothing Rules.
- 22. <u>All competitors must comply with the Firearms Licensing Laws of the State where the National Championships</u> <u>are being conducted. (When held in W.A. a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that State).</u>
- 23. Free junior nominations are open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at the time of nomination and will not be refunded retrospectively.
- 24. The sport of Clay Target Shooting is an outdoor sport with some risk, the ACTA through its rules minimises that risk. Competitors indemnify the ACTA in respect of all actions, claims, proceedings, losses, costs, expenses and damages which the competitor may suffer from participating.



Club History & Personalities

Jeparit Gun Club

Jeparit is a small town on the Wimmera River in Western Victoria, 370 kilometres north west of Melbourne. Its most notable claim is that it is the birthplace of Sir Robert Menzies, Prime Minister of Australia from 1939-1941 and 1949-1966, but did you know that in October 1979 it hosted the Victorian State DTL Carnival. At this time the population was just over 600 but as of the 2016 census, it was down to 477. The background photo shows the club grounds as they are today, having changed very little in the ensuing years since the State Carnival.

To hold a State DTL Carnival in 1979 the club needed a minimum of 4 layouts and each year in rotation each Victorian Zone was given the opportunity to run this prestigious event.

Jeparit is now the home club of the Hawker Family – Wayne, Lisa, Zoe and Kane but it was also the home club of June and Jim Gawith who are still actively involed with the club.

Jim was the Victorian North West Zone President for some years and also served on the VCTA Council during that time. June became the inaugural winner of the ACTA National Ladies Double Barrel in 1981 which was shot at the Melbourne Gun Club, shooting a score of 51/53. The National Ladies Double Barrel Perpetual Cup appropriately acknowledges this as the June Gawith Trophy.

At the time of the Carnival the town had virtually no shopping centre but one operating pub and I can remember spending time there over the weekend enjoying the company and listening to the bush yarns spun by the legendary shooter/ character and story teller Frank James.

This year on October 13th the North West Zone held one of their meetings at the club, followed by a shoot where I met up with June and Jim after many years and where I found them still busy catering for the shooters at the club.

To the right you will see a couple of extracts from the 1979 story, where you will notice the names of shooters who are still in the winners' circle today, some 40 years later. There are other photographs from the story over the page along with a report on the recent shoot.

If you are interested in reading the entire story you can find it in the ACTA archives of Clay Target Shooting News pages 24 – 26, December 1979.
